FOCUS: SCHOOL BASED HEALTH & WELLNESS CENTER



A School Based Health Center (SBHC) is a friendly, accessible place at a school where students can receive a variety of health services. The Des Moines Center is expanded to a community health and wellness center (DMSBHWC). The State of New Mexico funds health centers across the state, based on the community's needs and the children's health status. Additional monies are applied for through various organizations. No resources are taken away from education to support the SBHC. Residents of our school communities, in addition to school students, can benefit from extended services offered by service providers. Benefits include direct access to health care providers in a confidential setting, medical services in a non-intimidating environment, referrals to appropriate providers, coordination of care with primary care physician outside of the SBHWC, local access to care and wellness programs, and healthier living that leads to successful school performance and more productiv-

ity for students and residents. The SBHWC helps to "even the playing field" for citizens in these rural communities who have been underserved for so long.

In the 1990's, the Des Moines District set goals for increased health education programs and health services when its first Educational Plan for Student Success (EPSS) was written. In '02/'03, studies began to identify resources for a Center; in '07/'08, a grant was awarded and in '08/09, capital outlay funds were awarded for a building. Important relationships have served us well: NM Department of Health/Office of School and Adolescent Health, NM Alliance of School Based Health Care, Union County Health Council, Union County General Hospital/Clayton Family Practice, and valuable work with individual providers.

Nancy Passikoff, RN, serves as the Coordinator for the SBHWC and Rhonda Wingo is Administrative Assistant. Dr. Tena Hoyle, Superintendent, provides administrative support and oversight. Dr. Hoyle was acquainted with our SBHWC long before her arrival in our school district.


