Please Support the Two Mill Levy

The Des Moines Municipal School Board passed a resolution on November 9, 2010, setting Tuesday, February 1, 2011, as the date for the School Board election and the vote on a two-mill levy.

Our Des Moines School community has never failed to pass a mill levy election. Thank you for your support in past years and we hope we can count on your continued support. This two mill-levy **will not increase your tax rate**. In fact, the

school portion of your property taxes **has decreased** as the district continues to pay off bonds approved by voters in the past. If approved, this levy will be a continuation of the two-mill levy that is currently in place, no tax increase will result.

Continued support for this Public School Capital Improvement Tax is critical. This money is used for maintenance (building and vehicle), building and equipment repairs, and upkeep of the school grounds. In the past, the levy funds have been used for such projects as replacing a water heater, repairing the heating and electrical systems, and, most recently, renovating the locker room. This continuing source of revenue is crucial for the ongoing upkeep of the investments we have all made in our school facilities.

The Des Moines School Board and the school staff is committed to providing a safe and comfortable learning environment for the students of our community. We appreciate your continuing support. Please vote in support of the two mill levy.

Des Moines School Based Health Center Seeks Grant

What an exciting time for our School Based Health Center! The last few months have been a flurry of activities as we have had the opportunity to apply for a \$500,000.00 federal grant (**free money**) to improve the size, and efficiency of our School Based Health Center.

During the months of October thru December we gathered surveys from students, parents, and other community members to find out what they felt were issues that needed to be both improved and / or successfully continued. We received a very nice number of responses...and some very detailed replies. The detailed surveys were the most helpful. We can't fix what doesn't work if we don't know it's not working, nor can we improve in areas that are a concern if we don't realize there is a level of concern.

The results from the surveys and input from members of our community helped us format the improvements we proposed for the new Health Center. The proposal is to build, in the same location as the current School

Based Health Center, a more "friendly" appearing building with an exterior somewhat similar to the Senior Center. It will be slightly larger due to the addition of a dentist office and a more efficient office plan. We're planning a more inviting waiting area with more space and comfort. We heard, and shared your concerns, about the feeling of lack of privacy due to the sound issues. The existing center was marketed as properly soundproofed, but we found that is not the case. Constructing a new building will allow us to manage the sound attenuation, making the offices properly soundproofed, thus successfully addressing everyone's right to privacy.

Some other expressed concerns...wanting / needing a more reliable medical provider schedule and having the ability to fill basic prescriptions on site. The new floor plan will include a lab and separate, properly manageable pharmacy (we have current licenses for these items). The providers are excited about working with our Center and are interested in providing regularly scheduled hours as long as there is a demand for their services. We do have to make it worth their time to drive here and spend their day with us.

We have many exciting changes happening at the Health Center. We encourage you to come by to visit and check us out. Our School Based Health Center has been a blessing for so many and we invite you to join us in making the Center an even better resource, not only for our school, but for our entire community as well.
